The Dunsandel School Board of Trustees adopted an Enrolment Scheme after a directive from the Ministry of Education. The Enrolment Zone map and Zone description form this information booklet. Please be aware that the map in this information despite saying proposed enrolment scheme are the actual boundaries that the Ministry of Education and Board of Trustees have signed off on.

The Dunsandel School Enrolment Scheme came into effect on the first day of term three 2010 (Monday 19 July 2010).

Currently Dunsandel School does not take any out of zone enrolments.

We are a contributing school to Ellesmere College along with Leeston Consolidated School and Southbridge School. Our Enrolment Zone does sit on top of the College boundaries meaning that if you are in our zone you are also in the Ellesmere College Zone.

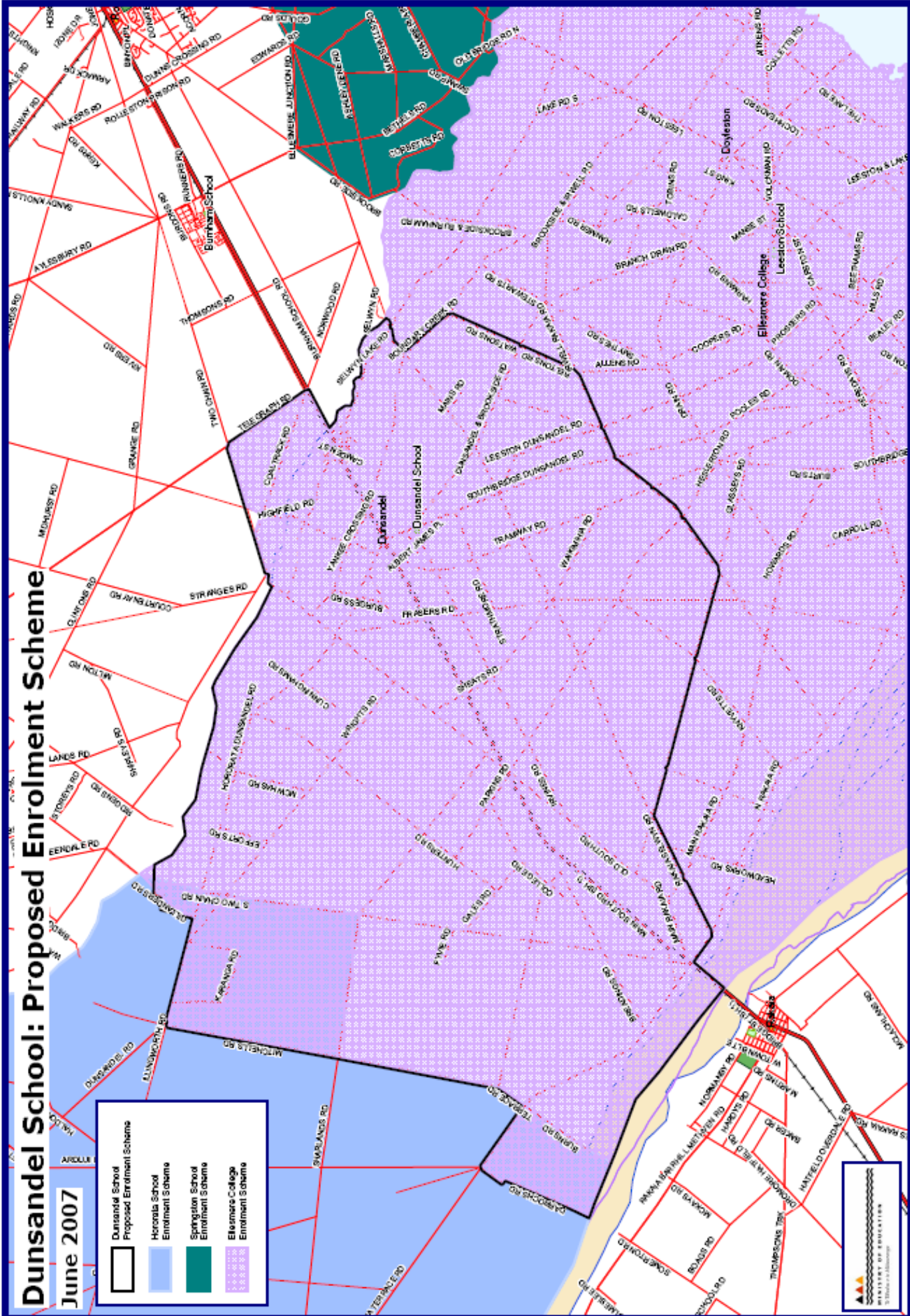
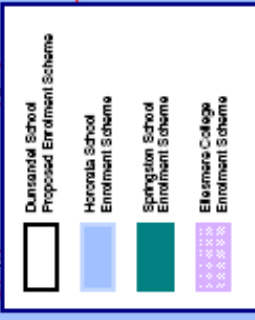

# Dunsandel School Enrolment Scheme

## Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below and shown on the attached map shall be entitled to enrol at Dunsandel School.

**The Home Zone of Dunsandel School is the area within the boundaries of:**

(Includes both sides of the road unless where stated)

- From Rakaia River bridge along the north bank of the Rakaia River to Darrochs Road
- Up Darraochs Road to Rakaia Terrace Road.
- Along Rakaia Terrace Road to Terrace Road
- Along Terrace Road to Mitchells Road.
- Along Mitchells Road to Hororata Dunsandel Road.
- Along Hororata Dunsandel Road to Gillanders Road
- Along Gillanders Road to the point (south side of the Selwyn River) where Old South Road meets Coaltrack Road
- Along Coaltrack Road to Highfield Road.
- Along Highfield Road to Two Chain Road.
- Along Two Chain Road to Telegraph Road.
- Along Telegraph Road to State Highway 1.
- Along State Highway 1 to the South bank of the Selwyn River. Along the Selwyn River to Rakaia Selwyn Road.
- Along the Selwyn Rakaia Road to Boundary Creek Road
- Along Boundary Creek Road to Watsons Road.
- Along Watson Road to Beltons Road.
- Along Beltons Road to Irwell Rakaia Road.
- Along Irwell Rakaia Road to Glasseys Road
- Along Glasseys Road to Rakaia Selwyn Road
- Along Rakaia Selwyn Road to State Highway One
- Along State Highway One to Rakaia River Bridge

Proof of residence within the Home Zone may be required

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

## Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

**First Priority** will be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in a special programme run by the school and approved by the Secretary for Education. (This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary).

**Second Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

**Third Priority** will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

**Fourth Priority** will be given to applicants who are children of board employees.

**Fifth Priority** will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship
