Welcome to week eight.

Country Day is 11 sleeps away. A reminder that the last day to hand in Pet Projects to teachers is this Monday 16 September. Please remember if your child is doing a research project, they must bring these to be judged on Country Day.

Our postponement day is Friday 27 September – We have sent your child home with the Country Day booklet for everyone to read, please take the time to read this as there is a lot of information about the day.

There is a lot of information in the newsletter this week. Please take the time to go through it carefully so your family knows what is happening for the rest of the term. Today we sent 5 children to represent our school at the **Canterbury Schools Duathlon**. Congratulations to **Charlie Schat** who was named captain of this team in assembly last week. We wish them the best of luck. Thank you to the parents and caregivers who supported our team and to Mr Happer for being a marshal out on the course.

West Bus Stop - We have had a safety message from our west bus driver that as he is turning around at the intersection of Mitchells Road and Sharlands Road, people are parking their cars on the west side of Mitchells Road, making it very difficult for him to turn and unsafe to pick children up. Could you please park on the east side of Mitchells Road, facing south and further down from the intersection – do not park and wait at the corner of Sharlands and Mitchells Road, the driver will not be picking children up at the intersection and will park further down the road and wait until children walk to the bus.

Selwyn Council – On Thursday we have Grant from the Selwyn Council to talk to our children about safety around dogs. This is to help children to be aware of dogs and hopefully to prevent accidents from happening especially with our Country Day happening next week.

Head-lice – Head-lice is out in our school. Head lice are small insects that live on the human scalp. They are common and anyone can catch head lice; catching them has nothing to do with not being clean. Please check your child's hair and if you find live head lice or eggs treat them. You can purchase treatment from the local supermarket or chemist. The 'wet combing' with cheap conditioner and a fine-tooth head lice (nit) comb is an effective way to find and remove head lice, if done properly. Make sure your child's hair is tied back every day as they can crawl from one person to another.
